Dear reader

The last few months have been particularly busy for many of us who are working to address climate change.

In August, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released a <u>Special Report on climate change and land</u>. The report finds that whilst land provides us with our homes, food, water and liveable environment, it's not in good shape with large areas subject to various forms of degradation and growing challenges to food security. Unfortunately, climate change will make this worse, exacerbating land degradation and putting pressure on our food, plants, animals and the communities that depend on them.

We actually have many solutions that will offer win-wins for farmers, rural communities, ecosystems and people generally. But at this stage, they aren't being used widely enough. Considering climate change in all land management decisions and scaling up both climate adaptation and emission-reduction solutions will benefit everyone.

On 25th September, the IPCC will release another Special Report. This will cover the interactions between climate change and the ocean, snow and ice-covered regions - you can hear about its implications at our <u>public lecture</u> with Prof Nerilie Abram on Tuesday 1st October.

Next week, the ACT Government will announce the new ACT Climate Change Strategy 2019-25 and Canberra's Living Infrastructure Plan - we'll be hosting another <u>public lecture</u> on 8th October to review the strategy and plan.

And on 23rd September, world leaders will converge in New York for the <u>UN</u> <u>Climate Action Summit</u> which has been convened to boost ambition and

It's in this context as well as that of the damaging fires still burning in NSW and Queensland that Australians are becoming increasingly concerned about climate change. This week, the <u>Climate of the Nation</u> study found that 81% of Australians are now concerned that climate change will result in more droughts and flooding. Almost two-thirds of Australians (64%) think that the country should have a national target for net-zero emissions by 2050, as the UK has done. Perhaps it would be good to be informed by the UK's positive experience with this action. We'll hear more about this at our <u>public lecture</u> with the Vice-Chair of the UK's Committee on Climate Change on 16th October.


