Philippines disaster update

Key data, as of November 22

- ▶ More than **4,000** killed
- ▶ About **1,600** missing
- ▶ **13.28 million** people affected
- ▶ **4.33 million** people displaced, including 1 million children
- ▶ **2.5 million** people require food aid
- ▶ UN aid appeal: **43%** of **\$301 million** now reached
- ▶ Nearly **1.1 million** houses destroyed or partially damaged
- ▶ **4.9 million** children at risk of acute malnutrition

- 6300 fatalities
- 1060 missing
- 11 Million people have been affected
- More than 2 Billion USD damage
- 150000 houses have been destroyed or damaged

- International request from ERCC received by COGIC on **Friday November 8 at 3:30 pm**
- Approval of the French authorities to send a detachment on **Friday November 8 at 4:10 pm**
- Constitution of detachment and equipment necessary for the mission
- On **Friday November 8 at 7 pm** 110 pax ready to go with 1 USAR team, 1 medical team, 1 water purification team, 1 command and control team

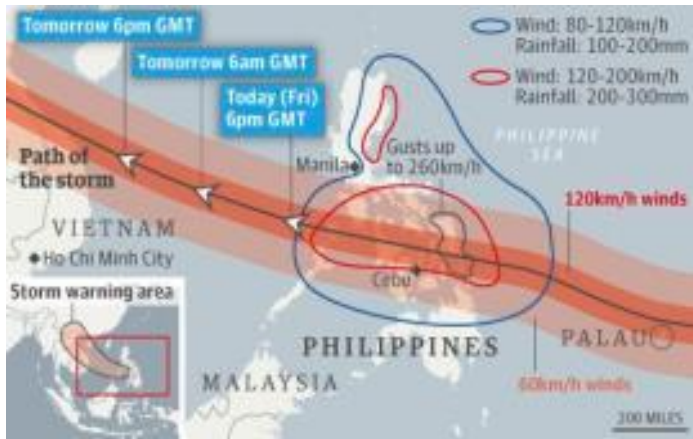


TYPHOON HAIYAN 2013

PHILIPPINES



- On **Friday November 8 at 9 pm**, 2 special flights are chartered by Ministry of Foreign Affairs, 1 A340 and 1 Cargo
- From **Friday November 8, 9 pm, to Saturday November 9, 3 am**, loading of 2 aircraft
- **Saturday November 9, 5:30 am**, departure from Paris
- **Sunday November 10, 7 am**, arrival in Manila



TYPHOON HAIYAN 2013



First mission

- Contact with OCHA (RDC/OSOCC), local authorities (NDRMCC), French Embassy
- Transfert and dispatch in Cebu island

In Cebu Island

- Support to local authorities
- Support traffic flow at the Cebu airport
- Assistance with unloading, storing and distributing international aid
- Assistance with setting up water purification stations
- Reaching and distributing assistance to isolated villages in Northern Cebu

PHILIPPINES

First actions

- Assessment of devastated area
- Support and provide assistance to the population
- Fix roofs
- Provide tents, tarpaulins, clothing, cooking kits, shelter matelas, emergency relief kits....
- Provide water purification units

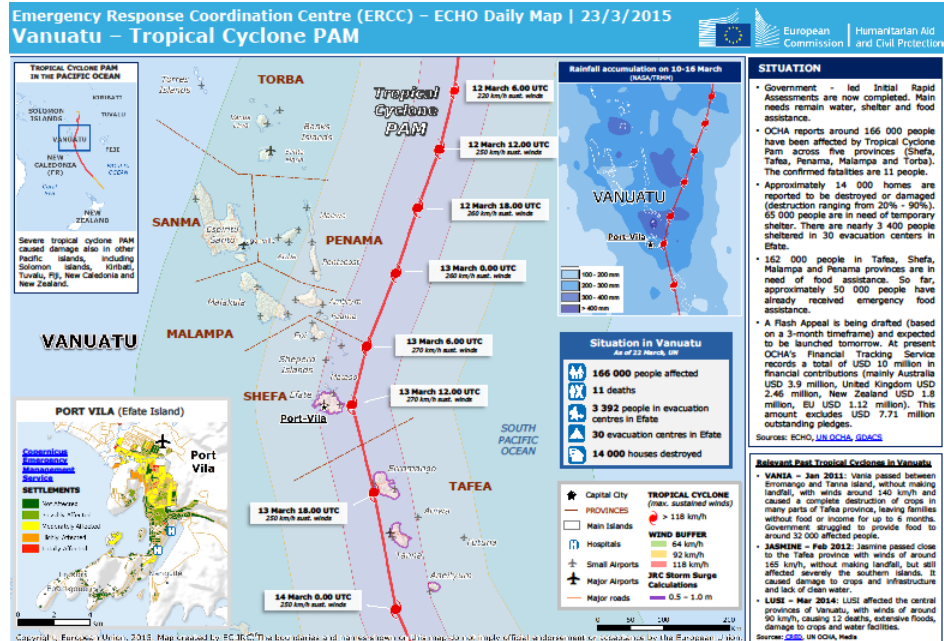


- 3 weeks of site-mission
- 27 people rescued
- More than 70000 people have been assisted
- 200 Tons of equipment distributed
- 1250 roof repairs
- 3 births

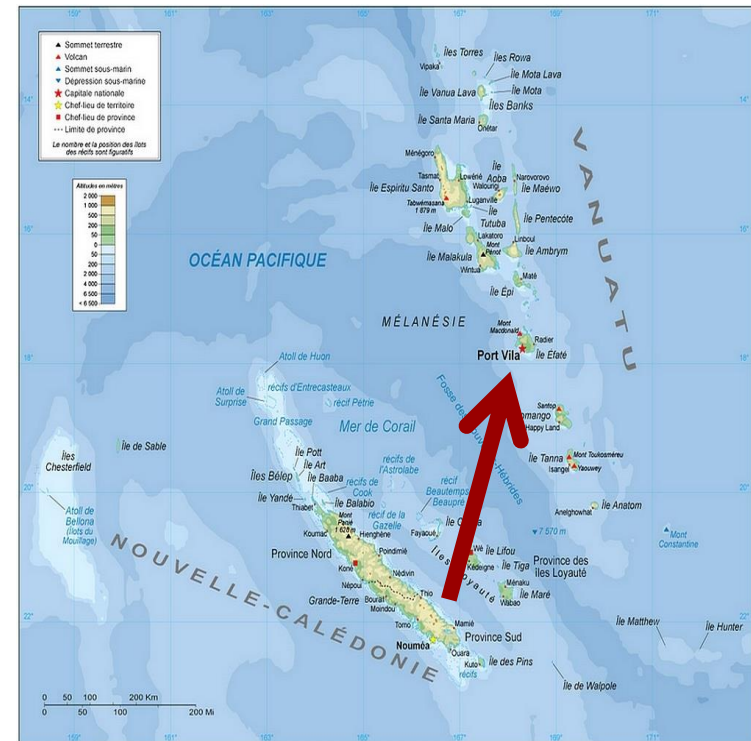


Category 5 on Saffir Simpson Scale



CYCLONE PAM 2015

- International request from Vanuatu Government received by COGIC on **Monday March 16 at 2:00 am**
- Approval of the French authorities to send a detachment from New Caledonia under the mandat of FRANZ agreement on **Monday March 16 at 10:00 am**
- Constitution of detachment and equipment necessary for the mission
- On **Tuesday March 17 at 7 am** 85 pax ready to go with 1 USAR team, 1 medical team, 1 command and control team, 3 tons of equipment
- On **Wednesday 18 at 6 am**, Pax and equipment were sent by French military vessel

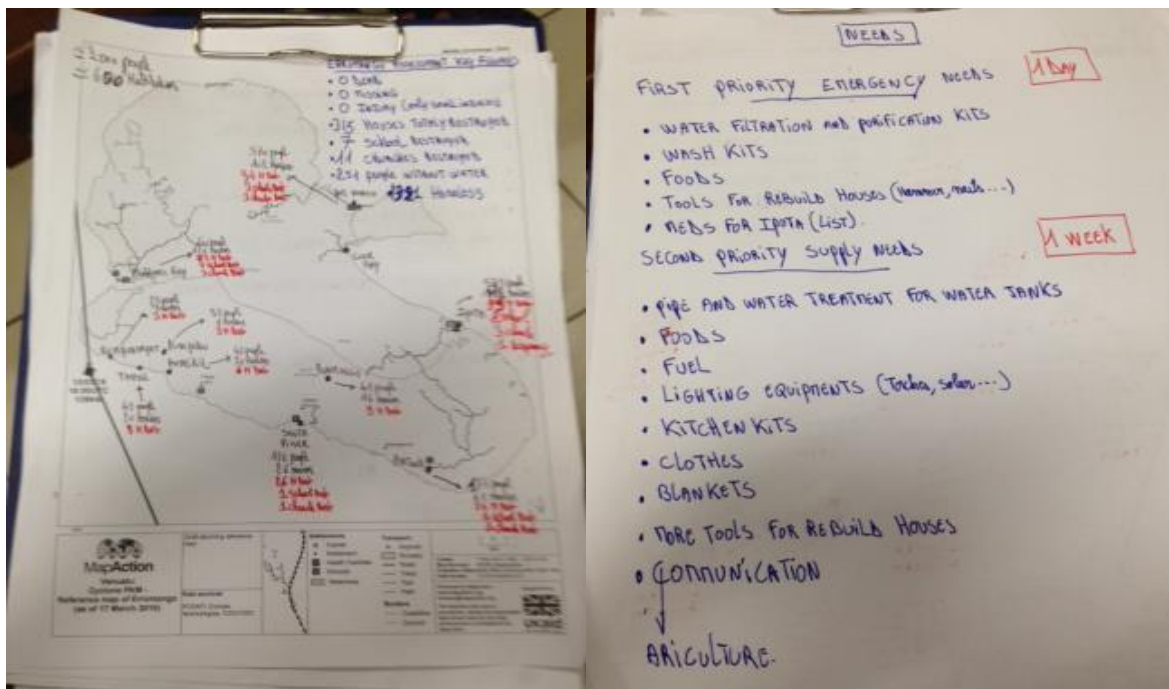

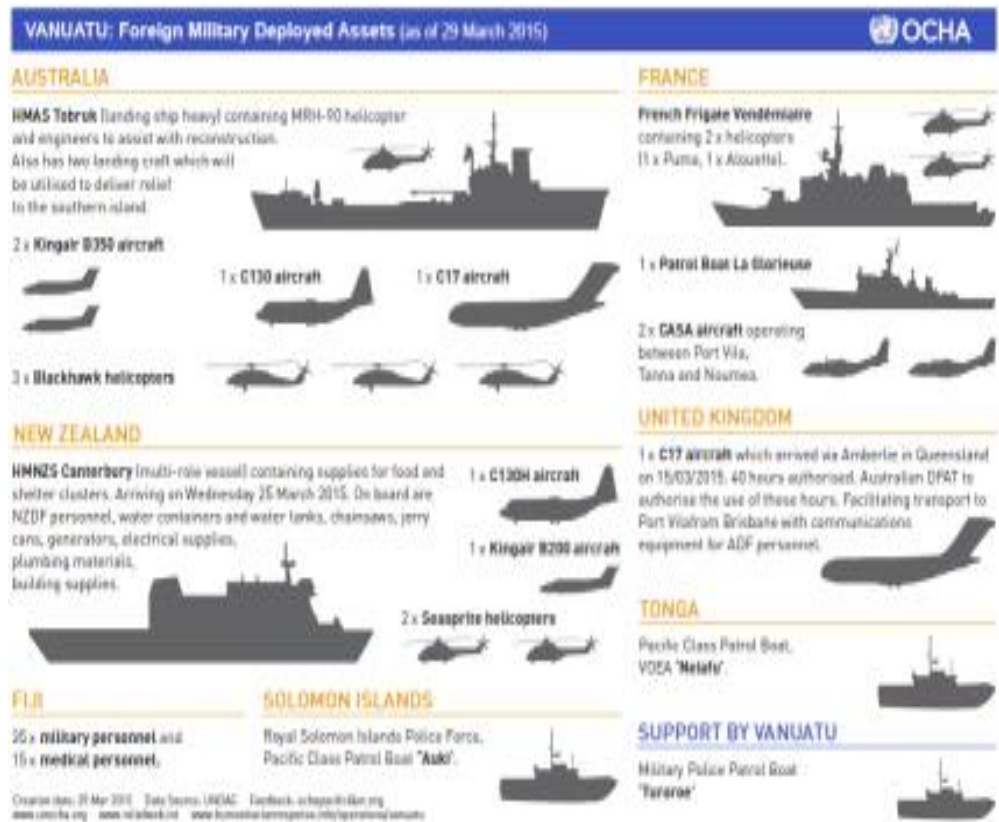
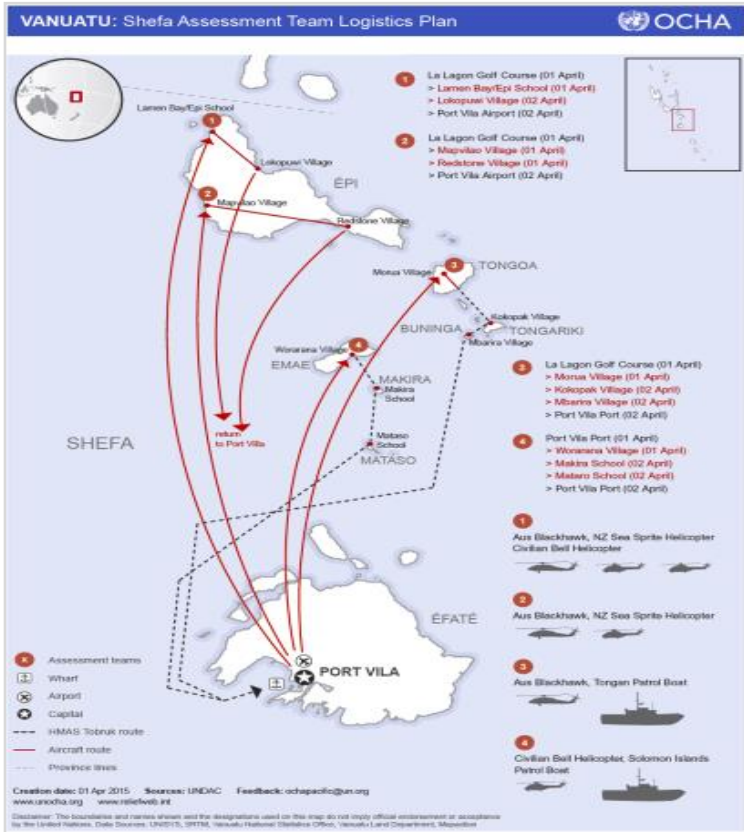
- 11 casualties
- 166 000 people affected
- 20% to 80% of houses destroyed in 22 islands
- 250 Million USD damage

- 2 weeks on site-mission
- 2 people rescued
- More than 15000 people have been assisted
- 20 Tons of equipment distributed
- More than 1000 houses repairs

CYCLONE PAM 2015



The support provided to the response by the Vanuatu Mobile Force (VMF), Vanuatu Police Patrol Boat, **and FRANZ partners (France, Australia and New Zealand)**, UK and Tonga, Solomon Islands and Fiji was critical to the success of the response
